

DUNDEE FOODBANK
helping feed local people in crisis

13 million people live below the poverty line in the UK. Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income.

All food is donated by the public and sorted by volunteers. Frontline care professionals such as doctors and social workers identify people in crisis and issue a food voucher. Clients receive three days of nutritionally balanced, non-perishable food in exchange for their food voucher. Foodbanks also make time to chat and to signpost clients to other helpful services

The Foodbank has provided aid to more than 2,200 people in Dundee since April and expects that figure to have reached 3,000 by the end of the financial year. The Foodbank provides a minimum of 3 days emergency food and support to local people in crisis.

From the beginning of 2013 Muirhead Church will be acting as a weekly collection point for donations of non-perishable foods.

Items can be handed into the Church on Sunday morning from 10.00 am to 1.00 pm.
